Notes on the undergraduate curriculum:

- ‡ Incoming students do not have to enroll in CC1 (CIS/WRD 110) if they have any of the following: 1) an ACT English score of 32 or higher; 2) an SAT Verbal score of 700 or higher; or 3) a score of 4 or 5 on the English Language AP exam. In these situations, the student should replace CIS/WRD 110 with electives.
- ✕ The Linguistics Major requires completion of the 4th semester of college-level language.
- ◇ 6 hours of “free” electives – that do not count toward any other requirement – must be taken. Additional electives may be required to reach the required minimum of 120 hours. Consider pursuing a 2nd major or minor.
- * To be discussed with your academic advisor in Linguistics.

Notes on the USP curriculum:

- Students must apply to the graduate program in the spring of their JUNIOR year for acceptance into the University Scholars Program (USP).
- Courses highlighted in YELLOW are those that count toward BOTH the undergraduate degree and the graduate degree. The student is advised to discuss the senior year course schedule with their undergraduate advisor in Linguistics and with the Linguistics Director of Graduate Studies.
- The graduate degree requires 30 credits of course work, of which 12 may be taken in year four. Thus 18 credits must be taken in year five in order to graduate in 4+1 years with both the Bachelor’s and Master’s degrees.
- At least 15 credits must be taken at the 600- or 700-level (counting toward the graduate degree), including those taken for graduate credit in Year Four.
